UPPER GOULBURN CATCHMENT

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, & c, & c, & c.

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in Section 22 of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilisation Act 1947* do by this my Proclamation define the water supply catchment to be known as the Upper Goulburn Catchment as follows:-

Commencing at the eastern end of the wall of the Eildon Dam on the Goulburn River, thence southerly along the watershed between Snobs Creek and Jerusalem Creek to Mt Torbreck; thence continuing southerly along the watershed between the head waters of Snobs Creek, Royston and Taggerty Rivers on the west and the Big River on the east to Mt Arnold; thence generally in a south easterly and easterly direction along the Great Dividing Range over Mt Matlock and Mt Singleton to Mt Selma; thence generally in a north easterly, north westerly and northerly direction along the Great Dividing Range to Mt Macdonald; thence continuing along the Great Dividing Range generally in an easterly and north easterly direction over Mt Magdala to Mt Howitt; thence generally in a north westerly direction along the watershed between the head waters of the King River to the north east of Howqua and Delatite Rivers to the south west; thence continuing generally westerly and north westerly along the watershed between the Broken River on the north and Ford and Brankeet Creeks on the south; thence in a generally south westerly direction along the watershed between the Seven Creeks on the north west and the Gerar and Merton Creeks on the south east to a point on the watershed west of the township of Merton; thence generally in a south easterly direction along the watershed between the head waters of the Hume, Colonial and UT Creeks on the south west and the immediate catchment of the Western or Delatite Arm of the Eildon Reservoir to the western and of the wall of Eildon Dam; thence across the crest of the Dam to the commencing point.

The area described is more particularly defined on a plan lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew.
