PROCLAMATION


By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and having considered a recommendation of the Land Conservation Council in pursuance of the provision contained in Section 22(1) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act* 1958 (No. 6372) and Section 5(1)(b) of the *Land Conservation Act* 1970 (No. 8008) do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment areas to be known as the Nine Mile Creek, Clear Creek and Hurdle Creek (Lake Kerferd) Water Supply Catchments.

The area proclaimed for Nine Mile reek is the catchment to an offtake constructed by the Yackandandah Waterworks Trust within Reserved Forest, Parish of Stanley. The area proclaimed for Clear Creek is the catchment to an offtake to be constructed by the Yackandandah Waterworks Trust within Reserved Forest, Parish of Stanley. The area proclaimed for Hurdle Creek is the catchment to Lake Kerferd within a Water Reserve in the Parish of Stanley and controlled by the Shire of Beechworth as the Local Governing Body.

The use of land within these catchments is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of Section 22(2) and 23(1)(a)(b) and (c) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, as amended.

The area described is indicated on Plan No. S-739 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew, 3101.
